Title: The Changing of the Guard

Text: 1 Kings 19:15-16, Selected Theme: The Challenges of Senior Pastor Succession Teaching:

I. It's about calling, not _

1 Kings 19:15-16 "The LORD said to him, 'Go, return on your way to the wilderness of Damascus, and when you have arrived, you shall anoint Hazael king over Aram; 16 and Jehu the son of Nimshi you shall anoint king over Israel; and Elisha the son of Shaphat of Abel-meholah you shall anoint as prophet in your place."

Philippians 1:5 "...in view of your participation in the gospel from the first day until now"

Paul began to preach and teach the Gospel. Acts 9:20 "and immediately he began to proclaim Jesus in the synagogues, saying, 'He is the Son of God.'"

The church had to change their thinking about Paul. Acts 9:21-22 "And all those hearing him continued to be amazed, and were saying, 'Is this not he who in Jerusalem destroyed those who called on this name, and who had come here for the purpose of bringing them bound before the chief priests?' But Saul kept increasing in strength and confounding the Jews who lived at Damascus by proving that this Jesus is the Christ."

II. Things will _____

Paul had a dubious resume. Acts 9:1 "Now Saul, still breathing threats and murder against the disciples of the Lord, went to the high priest…"

Paul gets saved.

Acts 9:17-19 "And Ananias departed and entered the house, and after laying his hands on him said, 'Brother Saul, the Lord Jesus, who appeared to you on the road by which you were coming, has sent me so that you may regain your sight, and be filled with the Holy Spirit.' And immediately there fell from his eyes something like The church embraced Paul and the changes that were about to come.

Acts 13:1-3ff "And while they were ministering to the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, 'Set apart for Me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them."

A. In the midst of change, never changes. Malachi 3:6 "For I, the Lord, do not change..."

Hebrews 13:8 "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today, yes and forever."

Romans 8:28 "And we know that God causes all things to work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose."

B. In the midst of change, God's never changes. Isaiah 40:8 "The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God stands forever."

Mark 13:31 "Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will not pass away."

Psalm 119:160 "The sum of Thy word is truth..."

John 14:6 "Jesus said to him, 'I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father, but through Me."

Psalm 119:105 "Thy word is a lamp to my feet, and a light to my path."

Romans 8:38-39 "For I am convinced that neither death. nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other created thing, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Philippians 1:9 "And this I pray, that your love may abound still more and more in real knowledge and all discernment..."
